- Avoid littering and respect nature.



#### **Learning Experience**

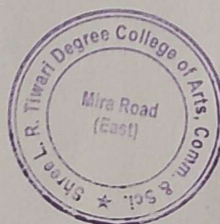

## Feedback Analysis Report on Field Visit to Sanjay Gandhi National Park

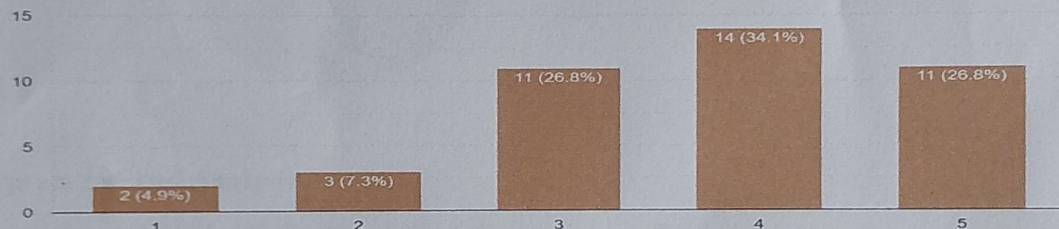

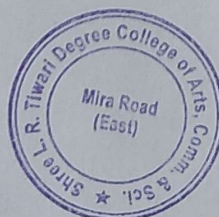
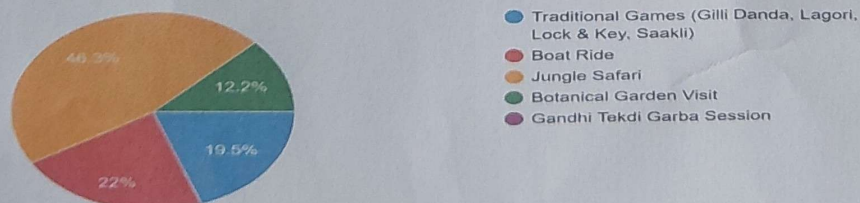

### Interpretation and Analysis:

The survey results indicate that the majority of respondents had a positive experience during the field visit. 34.1% rated it as "Very Good" (4), and 26.8% rated it as "Excellent" (5), showing that over 60% had a favorable impression. Another 26.8% rated it as "Good" (3), indicating a satisfactory experience. However, a small portion of respondents (7.3% and 4.9%) rated it as "Fair" (2) and "Poor" (1), suggesting that some improvements may be needed. Overall, the feedback is predominantly positive, but addressing concerns from lower ratings could further enhance future visits.

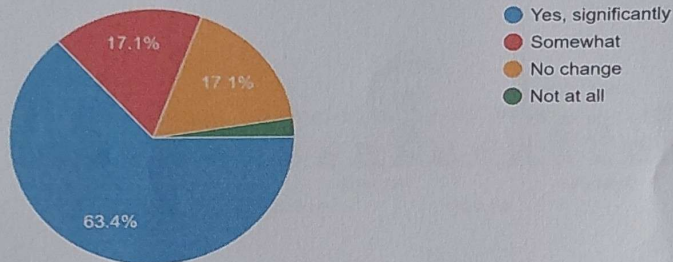

## Interpretation and Analysis:

The **Jungle Safari** was the most enjoyed activity, with **46.3% of respondents** selecting it, indicating a strong preference for adventure and wildlife experiences. The **Boat Ride** followed with **22%**, showing significant interest in water-based activities. **Traditional Games (19.5%)** were also well-received, suggesting appreciation for cultural and nostalgic experiences. The **Botanical Garden Visit (12.2%)** had the least engagement, possibly due to lower excitement compared to other activities. The **Gandhi Tekdi Garba Session** was not mentioned in the chart, implying minimal or no votes. Overall, nature and adventure activities were the highlights of the field visit.

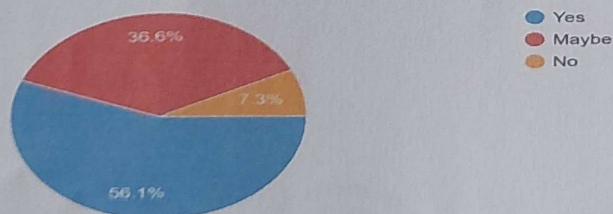
Did this visit increase your awareness about biodiversity and environmental conservation?

## Interpretation and Analysis:

The survey results indicate that the field visit was highly effective in raising awareness about biodiversity and environmental conservation. A **majority (63.4%) reported a significant increase** in awareness, highlighting the success of the visit in educating participants. **17.1% felt "somewhat" impacted**, suggesting room for deeper engagement. However, **another 17.1% saw "no change,"** indicating that some participants may have already been aware or found the visit less impactful. Only a **small percentage showed no awareness gain at all**, meaning the trip was largely beneficial. Future visits could include more interactive sessions to engage those with minimal impact.

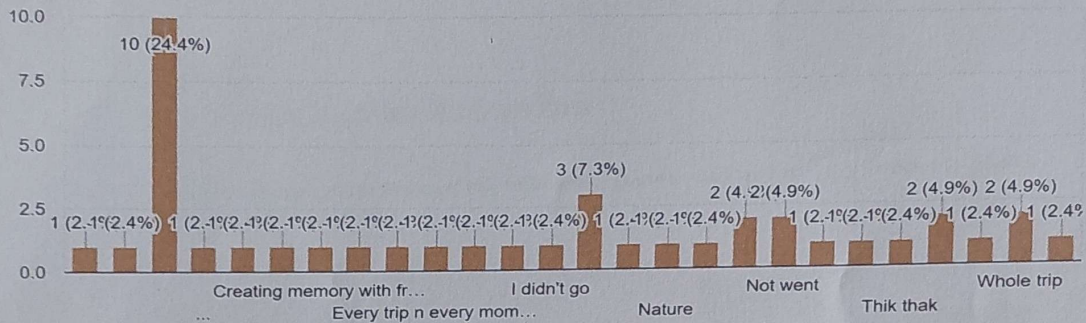

The survey results show strong support for organizing more frequent visits. **56.1% of respondents answered "Yes,"** indicating a clear interest in such experiences. **36.6% chose "Maybe,"** suggesting that while they see value, factors like scheduling or content may influence their decision. Only **7.3% responded "No,"** showing minimal opposition to these visits. The overall positive response highlights that participants found the experience valuable and would like more opportunities. Organizers might consider increasing the frequency or diversifying the activities to maintain engagement and cater to different preferences.

## Interpretation and Analysis:

The responses indicate diverse memorable moments from the trip, with no single dominant experience. **The most popular response (24.4%) is unclear due to truncation, but it stands out significantly.** This suggests a shared highlight among participants. Other responses are widely distributed, showing that different aspects of the trip were meaningful to different individuals. A few respondents mentioned "Nature," "Whole trip," and "Creating memories with friends," indicating that both social and environmental aspects were impactful. Some responses like "I didn't go" or "Not went" (around 7.3%) indicate that a few participants were unable to attend. Overall, the trip provided varied and memorable experiences for most attendees.
