This Policy proposes the revision and revamping of all aspects of the education structure, including its regulation and governance, to create a new system that is aligned with the aspirational goals of 21st century education, including SDG4, while building upon India's traditions and value systems.

The vision of the Policy is to instill among the learners a deep-rooted pride in being Indian, not only in thought, but also in spirit, intellect, and deeds, as well as to develop knowledge, skills, values, and dispositions that support responsible commitment to human rights, sustainable development and living, and global well-being, thereby reflecting a truly global citizen.

If you are a prospective undergraduate student of Shree L. R. Tiwari Degree College of Arts, Commerce & Science, affiliated to the University of Mumbai, you are advised to go through the Government of Maharashtra – GR dated 20th April 2023 for clarity on the various rules and regulations as recommended by the state department of Higher and Technical Education.

## Salient Features of NEP2020

The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP2020) in India brings several significant changes compared to the prevalent education policy at the time of its introduction. Here are some key differences between the prevalent education policy and NEP2020:

- ✦ **Multi disciplinary Approach:** NEP2020 promotes a multi disciplinary approach to education, encouraging students to choose subjects across different disciplines and bridging the gap between arts, sciences, and humanities.
- ✦ **Reduction in Content Overload:** NEP2020 emphasizes reducing the content overload in the curriculum to focus on core concepts and critical thinking rather than rote memorization.
- ✦ **Skill Development and Vocational Education:** NEP2020 places significant importance on skill development and vocational education, aiming to provide students with practical skills and promote entrepreneurship.
- ✦ **Assessment Reforms:** NEP2020 advocates for a shift in assessment methods, aiming to move away from high-stakes examinations and focus on a more comprehensive and holistic assessment of student understanding and skills.
- ✦ **Inclusion and Equity:** NEP2020 emphasizes inclusion and equity in education, aiming to address gender and social disparities, provide equal opportunities for marginalized communities, and promote inclusive education for students with disabilities.
- ✦ **Research and Innovation:** NEP2020 recognizes the importance of research and innovation in education, encouraging the establishment of research centers and promoting a culture of research among students and teachers.
- ✦ **Internationalization:** NEP2020 recognizes the significance of internationalization in education. It encourages collaborations and exchange programs between Indian and foreign institutions, promoting global exposure and cross-cultural learning. Implementation: NEP2020 is being gradually implemented across educational institutions in India, including Mumbai University. All the proposed changes may take time to fully integrate, but the policy aims to create a more inclusive, flexible, and relevant education system.

- ✦ Promotion of Indian Languages: communication skills in English for personal growth. learning cultural moorings of our country, study materials in the local languages

NEP 2020 encourages the internationalization of higher education by promoting collaborations with foreign universities, facilitating student and faculty exchange programs, and attracting foreign students to Indian institutions. This is aimed at enhancing the global competitiveness of Indian higher education and fostering cross-cultural learning experiences.

### The framework of the choice-based credit system:

#### Vertical 1 -

**Major Subject:** A single subject course of study pursued by a student as a mandatory requirement of the programme of study.

**Elective Course:** An elective course could be a project designed to acquire skills to supplement the major study.

#### Vertical 2 -

**Minor Subject:** A second subject of study pursued by a student as an additional requirement of the programme of study.

#### Vertical 3 -

**OE: Open Elective -** An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, to seek multidisciplinary exposure.

#### Vertical 4 -

**VSC: Vocational Skill Course -** Courses aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, and soft skills to increase the employability of students. Specific or supporting the major subject is to be chosen from a basket/pool offered by the college.

**SEC: Skill Enhancement Course -** Courses aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, and soft skills to increase students' employability. It could be chosen from a basket/pool offered by the college or a MOOC on Swayam or NPTEL platforms.

#### Vertical 5 -

**AEC: Ability Enhancement Course -** Mandatory Courses on content related to Language, and Literature.

**VEC: Value Education Course -** courses on The Constitution of India and Environmental Education.

**IKS: Indian knowledge system -** to be included in the courses.

#### Vertical 6 -

**On-Job Training (OJT)/Internship/Field Project (FP)/Community Engagement Programme (CEP) Research Project (RP):** Application of knowledge/concepts in solving or analyzing a real-life problem. All these are related to the major subject.

**CC: Co-curricular Course -** For the holistic development of students through Cultural activities such as performing art, visual art, NCC, NSS, Yoga, etc.

The tables below contain the planned quantum of courses that will be offered under the Arts, Science, and Commerce programs starting from June 2024. The total credits that a student will collect in each semester is 22. This is as per the directives of Maharashtra State. A student is free to exit at the end of each academic year as depicted in the table below.

On successful completion of three years and obtaining 132 credits, a student can opt for an exit with a bachelor's degree in their domain, e.g., Bsc / BA / B.Com. The student must have a minimum CGPA of 7.5, to be eligible to obtain an 'Honours' degree. They would need to complete the fourth year of the said programme and acquire 176 credits for a bachelor's degree with Honours. If a student opts for an Honours degree by Research, the eligibility criteria will be as per the guidelines of the University of Mumbai.

#### NOTE:

- ✦ On exiting after three years of Undergraduate education, a student can further pursue a Postgraduate degree, requiring the successful completion of four semesters (2 years) of advanced course work along with research projects in their domain of specialization.
- ✦ ii. After completing the fourth year of Undergraduate education, a student can further pursue a Postgraduate degree, requiring the successful completion of two semesters (1 year) of advanced coursework along with research projects in their domain of specialization.

## PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

**Admission Rules:** Students seeking admission to the Degree College must fill the online application form available on college website after filling in the E-Samarth for first year, second year & M.Com students and MKCL for third year student form. Form submission and admission are to be done as per the schedule and guidelines given by the University.

**University Enrollment:** All students joining First Year of all courses and students coming from other Universities to the Degree College must get themselves enrolled in the University. Learners passing 10+2 from other than Maharashtra Higher Secondary Board need to procure eligibility. Original H.S.C. Mark Sheet or Equivalent Examination will also have to be submitted to the University for Verification. The responsibility for completing the requirements on time rests with the students, otherwise their term will not be granted by the University.

**University Ordinances Regarding Attendance Ordinance No. 0.6086:** For granting the terms in each course, a minimum of 75% attendance in the theory lectures, practical's, and tutorials will be required out of the total number of lectures, practical's, and tutorials in the course conducted during the term. Further, it is mandatory for every student to have a minimum of 50% attendance for each course (paper) and average attendance has to be 75%. On the basis of the above ordinance the College expects a student to fulfil the following requirements:

1. The attendance in theory lectures/practical/tutorials in each course has to be minimum 75%.
2. Minimum attendance of 75% is required for each semester.
3. Participation of a student in any extra-curricular activity such as sports, N.C.C., N.S.S., etc. gets credited entire attendance for the period he/she missed on those grounds. This is, however, course to production of certificate of participation by the concerned student. At the beginning of the academic year, students will have to give in writing an undertaking duly signed by him/her and counter signed by his/her parent/guardian, to the effect that he/she would fulfil all the requirements of the College and the University stated above.

**Prohibition of Ragging Act/Ordinance UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009.**

"Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in this institution including in its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sport, kiosk, canteen and the like) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whether public or private.

- The Institution shall take strict action including but not limited to criminal proceeding and/or cancellation of admission against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging and the burden of proof shall lie on the perpetrator of alleged ragging and not on the victim.
- An offence of Ragging may be charged either on a written complaint by the affected or on independent finding of the Anti-Ragging Squad. The institution is bound by the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009." Ragging of any nature by any student or any other person is a serious punishable offence and must be reported to Warden/Teacher/Principal or Management to immediately curb the menace of ragging.
- The order of The Honourable Supreme Court of India regarding punishment for ragging is as follows: "If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the institution."

### Eligibility

- A student Passing the H. S. C. Examination conducted by the Maharashtra state board for secondary and higher secondary Education, Mumbai Divisional Board in the six subjects specified below is eligible for admission to the First year of the senior College in Arts / science / Commerce course.
- English Medium
- Any one of the Modern Indian Languages (Marathi / Hindi etc. Or any one of the Modern European (French or German) or any one of the classical languages.
- Any four of the optional subjects for Art's, science and commerce courses as specified by the H. S. C. Board.
- Eligible candidates will be admitted directly by the college in merit as per the schedule given by University of Mumbai. Reservation of seats will be observed as per government rules.

### Documents to be submitted with the application Form:

- 1) At the time of admission board or the central board of secondary Education or the Indian School certificate Examination or anything equivalent examination will be admitted on merit with production of
- 2) Original Mark sheet for H. S. C examination with a photocopy
- 3) College/ school Leaving certificates or NOC from the previous college
- 4) Provisional/ Final Eligibility Certificate wherever necessary, and any other certificates that are deemed necessary.
- 5) An ex-student of the college who had left the college to do the same or any other Course outside, and now desires to seek admission to the first-year course in Art's/science/commerce after passing the HSC examination from Mumbai Divisional Board, will be treated as a new / fresh student (I.e. he will not be been titled to the benefits of continuation in the college.)
- 6) A student who passed the HSC examination in the science stream with minimum 2 of the subjects from the arts/science/Commerce group will be considered for admission to F. Y. B. A / F.Y.B. Com as per the provision of the University of Mumbai Circular.



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- 7) The application of an overseas students for admission to the college will be entertained only if it is forwarded with the recommendation letter of the Indian Diplomatic Mission in his/her country. Such application must be accompanied by
  - The final school/college certificate examination,
  - A testimonial from the principal of the school/college regarding the character of the applicant, and
  - A provisional eligibility certificate issued by the University of Mumbai.
- 8) Students from other Universities should provide Migration certificate during the time of admission
- 9) The application for a migration must be accompanied by a transfer certificate, which should be Submitted during the admission
- 10) Students receiving a government or college scholarship or any remission in fees must note that the grant and continuance are subject to good behaviour, regular attendance, satisfactory progress and good academic results at college and board.

### Transfer Certificate

- The College is entitled to charge a fee of Rs. 100/- for issuing the Transfer Certificate.
- A Transfer Certificate shall not be granted except for reasons which appear to be sufficient and except with the written permission of the Principal of the college which he/she intends to join

### Refund of Tuition, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admission:

The candidates who have taken admission in under graduate courses in Govt. colleges, in Govt. aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges, and recognized Institutions may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30 day after the date of cancellation and thereafter. The percentage of fee for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows:

- i) All the fee items chargeable for one year are as per as per relevant University circulars for different Faculties (excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities).
- ii) The fee charged towards group insurance and all the fee components to be paid as University share (including Vice- Chancellor fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, disaster management fund, exam fee and Enrollment fee) are non –refundable.

iii) Fee collected for Identity card and Library card, admission form and prospectus, enrollment and any other course specific fee are not refundable after the commencement of the academic term.

### Code of conduct for students

- All students must wear their I-Card at all times in the College premises. Students not carrying valid I-Card may be denied entry in to College premises
- Student behavior must at no point disturb the conduct of lectures and practical's in their classes. There should be no loitering and littering.
- Any form of gambling, smoking, consumption of alcohol or substance abuse is strictly prohibited in the College premises.
- Students should dress & behave in a manner appropriate for an educational institution.
- Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the class rooms, library, laboratories, and corridors of the classroom blocks. In the classrooms, library and laboratories mobiles must be switched off or kept on silent mode.
- All College activities require the prior permission of the Principal. No Society or Association shall be formed in the College and no person shall be invited to address a meeting without the prior permission of the Principal.
- The use of the College Hall, classroom, Audio Visual Room, needs the prior permission.
- College property must be used with care and caution. Banners must be hung at predetermined places. Posters are not allowed to be pasted on the walls of the buildings.
- Students must take responsibility for all their belongings. College does not take any responsibility in this regard. All unclaimed books, bags, etc. must be deposited at the College Office.
- Application for any certificate or any attestation must be routed through the Office.
- Attendance for all lectures and practical's is compulsory. Absence from lectures and practical's must be justified in writing, if illness is the cause; a medical certificate must be submitted within 7 days. (As minimum attendance of 75% for lectures as well as practical's is required under University Guidelines).
- All the courses in the Degree College are full time. The attendance requirement will not be waived on grounds that a student is employed.



- No student shall collect any money or contribution for picnics, trips, educational visits, charity, or any other activity without the prior sanction of the Principal.
- No student shall communicate any information to or write about matters dealing with the College administration to the press.
- If for any reason, the continuance of a student in the College is, in the opinion of the Principal, detrimental to the best interests of the College, the Principal may ask such a student to leave the College without giving a reason for his decision which shall be final and binding.
- Students shall not do anything, either within or outside the College campus that will in any way interfere with its orderly administration and discipline.
- Insubordination, inappropriate language or misconduct is not permitted.
- Any specific event of indiscipline will call for disciplinary action.
- Do not litter around, leave canteen utensils unattended after eating and use the dust bins diligently.
- Students joining the College are supposed to accept and observe all the rules and regulations of the College and to submit to the normal enforcement of the same, to the satisfaction of the Principal whose decision in this regard shall be final. In all matters of discipline, the decision of the Principal will be final and binding. The College has a secure environment with CCTV cameras installed at all strategic places and aims to provide the students with an atmosphere conducive to learning.
- LOITERING in the corridors of the college is STRICTLY PROHIBITED. If any students are found loitering in the corridors, he will be penalized.
- No students should mishandle the college property/furniture/fixtures/electrical gadgets etc.
- Ragging in the college premises or outside the premises is prohibited and punishable according to the "Ragging prohibition Act, 1999".

## Attendance Policy as per University of Mumbai Ordinance 6086

At Shree L. R. Tiwari Degree College of Arts, Commerce & Science, we uphold the highest standards of academic discipline and student commitment. In compliance with **Ordinance 6086 of the University of Mumbai**, we ensure that students attend and actively participate in their academic journey. This ordinance replaces the previous Ordinances 119, 120, and 125 and has been effective since the academic year 2014-15.

### Attendance Requirements

Every bonafide student enrolled in a semester program is required to maintain a **minimum of 75% attendance**, which is calculated as an average of all lectures, tutorials, practical sessions, and other academic activities

- Students must attend at least 50% of each course and ensure an overall 75% attendance across subjects.
- Attendance credit will be given for academic excursions, field visits, and study tours as prescribed in the syllabus.
- Students representing the college/university in extracurricular/co-curricular activities, competitions, workshops, seminars, and camps will have their absence considered as attended, provided they have official approval.



## Attendance Committee

The committee maintains attendance records, issues timely warnings, and handles attendance-related grievances.

## Warning System and Monitoring

To help students maintain the required attendance percentage, the following measures will be taken:

1. **Monthly Monitoring:** Attendance lists will be displayed on the college notice board at the beginning of each month.
2. **Warning Letters:** Students falling short of attendance will receive written warnings at least twice per semester.
3. **Counseling Sessions:** Defaulting students will be called for counseling sessions, and if required, their parents/guardians will also be involved.
4. **Student Undertaking:** At the time of admission, students (and their parents, where necessary) must sign an undertaking acknowledging their understanding of the attendance policy and its consequences.

## Condonation of Attendance Shortage

In exceptional circumstances, the Principal/Director/Head of the college/institute/university department has the authority to condone up to an additional 25% of attendance based on valid reasons and recommendations from the Attendance Committee.

Valid reasons for condonation include:

- Student's illness, supported by medical documentation
- Illness or demise of a parent, with appropriate documentation
- Any other genuine hardship, verified by the Attendance Committee

A **personal hearing** will be given to each student before a final decision is made regarding condonation.

## Denial of Term and Examination Restrictions

Students failing to meet the required attendance criteria will not be allowed to keep terms and will be ineligible to appear for examinations. The process includes:

1. The Attendance Committee will recommend names of students who are not allowed to keep terms.
2. A final list of defaulting students will be displayed on the college notice board.
3. Students may appeal this decision within three days of the list being published.
4. After appeals are reviewed, the college will notify the Examination Controller, who will withdraw the examination forms of non-eligible students at least 10 days before the examination.

## Appeal Process for Students

Students whose terms are denied may submit an appeal to the Controller of Examinations within three days of receiving intimation. The appeal process includes:

- Submission of a prescribed appeal form along with the required fee.
- A formal hearing before the Appeals Committee.
- The final decision of the Appeals Committee will be binding and communicated to the student.



## SCHEMES OF EXAMINATION

The University of Mumbai currently follows the **Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS)** for its undergraduate and postgraduate courses. The CBCS allows students to choose from a variety of courses, including core courses, elective courses, and interdisciplinary options, providing them with flexibility in shaping their academic journey.

This system enables students to accumulate credits based on their course selection and performance, fostering a more personalized learning experience and giving them the ability to choose subjects aligned with their interests and career goals.

### Passing Standard (NON NEP2020)

The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain the minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course in all subjects except Foundation Course.

In the subject of Foundation Course, the learner shall have to obtain minimum of 40% marks (i.e. 10 out of 25) in project work and 40% marks in the Semester End Examination (i.e. 30 out of 75) separately to pass. A learner will be said to have passed in the subject if the learner passes the Internal Assessment (Project Work) and Semester End Examination together

**Credit : 02 (Total 50 Marks)** The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination. The learners shall obtain minimum of 40% marks (i.e., 08 out of 20) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e., 12 Out of 30) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade E to pass a particular semester. A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes individually in the Internal Assessment as well as Semester End Examination.

**Credit : 04 (Total 100 Marks)** The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination. The learners shall obtain minimum of 40% marks (i.e., 16 out of 40) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e., 24 Out of 60) separately, to pass the course and minimum of Grade E to pass a particular semester A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes individually in the Internal Assessment as well as Semester End Examination.



## A.T.K.T. RULES (Allowed to keep Terms)

**Amended R.8438 Eligibility for Admission to all the Under Graduate Programs (aided and non-aided) in the Faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce under Credit Based Semester and Grading System.**

i) Eligibility criteria for a learner, to be admitted in Semester V (Third year) of UG programs in Faculties of Arts and Commerce is amended as follows,

a) Shall have passed Semester I, II, III and IV in full

**OR**

b) Shall have passed Semester I and II in full and secured ATKT in the Second year by failing in not more than Two Courses in each of Semester III and Semester IV

**OR**

c) Shall have Secured ATKT in First Year by failing in not more than Two Courses in each of Semester I and Semester II and have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full

ii) Eligibility for admission to Semester V (Third year) of UG programs in Faculty of Science is amended as follows,

Learner shall have passed Semester I, II, III and IV in full

**OR**

iii) Learner shall have passed Semester I and Semester II in full and secured ATKT in Second Year by failing in

For programs with 900 and above marks in not more than Three Courses in each of Semester III and IV

For programs with less than 900 marks in not more than Three Courses with not more than total 200 marks in each of Semester III & IV

**OR**

Learner shall have passed Semester III and Semester IV in full and secured ATKT in First Year by failing in,

For programs with 900 and above marks in not more than Three Courses in each of Semester I and II

For programs with less than 900 marks in not more than Three Courses with not more than total 200 marks in each of Semester I & II.

iv) Amended R.8439 Additional Examination for Semester I and Semester II be held after the conduct of Semester II Examination in March/ April every year and Additional Examination for Semester III and Semester IV be held after the conduct of Semester IV Examination in March / April every year. However, Additional Examination for Semester II and Semester IV be held after 20 days and before 40 days from the date of declaration of result of the respective Semester End Examination.

## Unfair Means & RTI Cell

The college has a strict policy on academic misconduct. Exams are aimed at improved learning to motivate students for better performance and to provide a balanced and fair evaluation of each student. Resorting to unfair means practice in examinations is a punishable offence apart from being viewed as disrespectful towards the college and an unacceptable behavior towards sincere fellow candidates. The malpractices in examination are dealt by the college as per the Maharashtra ACT XXXI of 1982 and procedures and guidelines issued by University Of Mumbai

Notifications(Ordinance .5050).

Aim of the Committee

To set an inquiry behind the purpose of resorting to unfair means during examinations by following the procedure and guidelines issued by University of Mumbai. Objectives of the Committee

- To investigate the cases of unfair means during examinations.
- To conduct unbiased investigation against any unfair means case.
- To recommend action/s to the Principal regarding unfair cases
- To be unbiased and maintain honesty and transparency regarding any unfair means cases.
- To maintain overall discipline while dealing with unfair means practices in examinations in the college. Procedure for Investigation In Case Of Malpractices

A student who is caught talking in the classroom during the examination, possession of any electronic equipment(s)/mobile/smartwatch or is found resorting to any of the acts listed below will be treated as the case of use of unfair means.

The Junior Supervisor/Block Supervisor shall prepare a report about the use of unfair means resorted by the student and the student will also prepare and submit his/her statement in the format prescribed. The JS/BS shall take away the original answer book of the student and shall issue the new answer book to the student and submit original answer sheet separately to the Senior Supervisor. The Senior Supervisor shall forward the answer books, his report along with the report of the JS, undertaking and Statement of the Student in a separate sealed envelope to the Chief Conductor who shall hand over the envelope to the Chairperson of the Unfair Means Inquiry Committee with due acknowledgement.

The candidate may be served a show cause notice and made aware of the charges/allegations reported against him to prepare his/her defence at the time of his/her appearance before the Unfair Means Inquiry Committee and informing him/her thereby, of the proposed action to be taken in his/her case with a request to reply to the show cause notice as to why the action proposed under it should not be taken against him/her.



The student may submit his/her defence in writing to the committee before or during the meeting. The reply received by the Committee from the candidate when he/she appears before it and the oral submissions/clarifications given by the student, will be considered by the Committee and the committee shall submit its final recommendation i.e. findings to the Principal based on the evidence before the committee.

The punishment finally awarded can be equal to or less than what is mentioned in the show cause notice, but not more than what is mentioned therein.

The College Unfair Means Inquiry Committee is a recommendatory body. The Principal has to exercise his/her power U/S 87 of the Mumbai University Act, 1974 and issue final order.

The Broad Categories of Unfair means Resorted to by Students at the University/College/Institution Examinations and the Quantum of Punishment for each category thereof as per the rules, an Unfair Means Inquiry Committee is constituted by the college. The Committee is authorized to take disciplinary action for resorting to malpractices during examination conducted by the college.

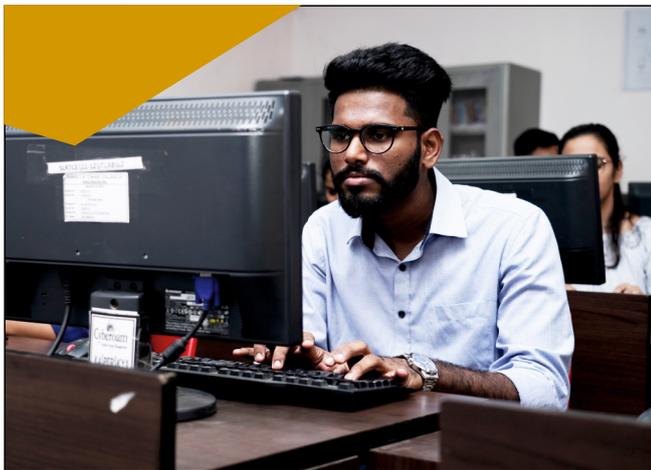
