
Objectives:

Report on Orientation Program for F.Y.B.Sc.CS Students

Examination Pattern:

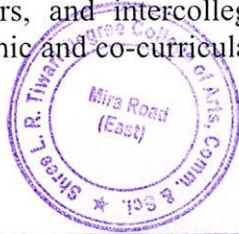

Career Planning and Higher Studies Guidance:



Outcomes of the Orientation:


- Students gained a clear understanding of the NEP-based degree structure, syllabus, and academic expectations.
